

WEATHER WATCH	WEATHER WARNING
<p>When a watch is issued it means conditions are favorable for severe weather to occur. A watch is usually longer in time and gives you time to prepare.</p>	<p>A warning is issued when the storm is actually occurring. This usually leaves very little time, if any, to prepare.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">This is the time to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Turn your radio or TV onto a local station.</li> <li>• Inform family members of the watch and know their location.</li> <li>• Ensure you have three days of supplies in place.</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;">You should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Immediately seek shelter.</li> <li>• Do Not Call 911 unless you have an emergency.</li> <li>• Listen to local media for further instructions.</li> </ul>

### What You Should Do

<u>Severe Thunderstorm</u>	<u>Winter Weather</u>
<p>Are extremely dangerous and can spawn tornadoes. You should stay inside, keeping away from windows and not use telephones or electrical appliances.</p>	<p>Stay inside if possible with an adequate food and fuel supply. If you need to travel, make sure family members know the route you are taking and equip your vehicle with an emergency supply kit.</p>

<u>Tornados</u>	<u>Flooding</u>
<p>Can occur with little or no warning. Seek shelter in the innermost room on the lowest level of your home. Avoid areas that have large freestanding roofs. Stay sheltered until the warning has expired and the storm activity has left the area.</p>	<p>Can occur very rapidly. Residents should be prepared to evacuate if necessary on a moment's notice. If you are driving, do not attempt to pass through freestanding water.</p>
