

1975 CRIME REPORT

CRIMES REPORTED:

SCANNED

In 1975, 1083 crimes were reported to the Washington County Sheriff's Department. 357 of these were classified as unfounded leaving 726 actual crimes. 156 (21.4%) of all actual crimes reported were cleared.

In 1974 a total of 1063 crimes were reported with 318 being unfounded, leaving a total of 745 actual crimes. 212 (28.6%) of these actual crimes were cleared.

There was a 7.2% decrease in actual crimes cleared in 1975 as compared to 1974.

All other crimes not listed above are class #2 crimes. There were 300 actual class #2 crimes reported in 1975 as compared with 272 reported in 1974. This is a 10% increase for 1975. In 1974, 70 (26%) of class #2 crimes were cleared as

expenses totaled \$1,463.99. The total of the preceding expenses is \$14,020.96.

In 1974, seven vehicles were driven a total of 192,027 miles. They consumed 18,090.5 gallons of gasoline at a cost of \$10,140.22. 85 quarts of motor oil were purchased by credit card and other expenses totaled \$1,222.95.

Increases in 1975 were 23,753 miles driven, 17,336.4 gallons of gasoline consumed, \$1,365.90 gasoline cost increase and a \$241.04 increase in other expenses. 1975's total increase in cost was \$1,636.90, a 14.4% increase.

TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS - DEATHS

The total traffic accidents for 1975 handled by this agency were 238. Three of these accidents involved fatalities. Other deaths handled were: Nature Accidents 6, Drownings 3, Suicides 4, Miscellaneous 8.

There were also 238 traffic accidents handled in 1974, seven of these being fatalities. There were 3 Nature Accidents Deaths, 2 Drownings, 3 Suicides and 13 Miscellaneous Deaths.

RADIO AND TELEPHONE:

In 1975, 34,233 telephone calls were received and 32,519 in 1974. This is a 1975 increase of 1,714 calls. In 1975 there were 36,141 radio calls and 39,009 in 1974. This is a 1975 decrease of 2,868 calls. Fire calls totaled 205 in 1975 and 117 in 1974, an increase of 88 for 1975. Wats calls increased 579 in 1975 with 2549 recieved as compared to 1970 in 1974.

compared to 71 (24%) in 1975. This shows a 2% decrease of class #2 crimes cleared in 1975 as compared to 1974.

ARRESTS:

In 1974, 14% of all crimes cleared involved persons under the age of 18 years. In 1975, 10% of all crimes cleared involved persons under the age of 18 years.

There were a total of 572 arrests in 1975 and 600 in 1974. This is a decrease of 28 (5%) in 1975. There were a total of 178 traffic arrests in 1975 and 157 in 1974 showing a 1975 increase of 21 (13%). Drunk driving arrests totaled 39 for 1974, and 37 for 1975, a decrease of two arrests in 1975. 6 A.W.O.L. arrests were made in 1975 and 9 in 1974, a 1975 decrease of three. 29 mentals were transported to mental institutions in 1975 compared to 15 transported in 1974. This is an increase of 14 (50%) in 1975. A total of 372 criminal arrests were made in 1975 and 380 in 1974. This is a 1975 decrease of 58 or 15% in arrests.

PRISONERS:

There were 1793 prisoners held in jail in 1975. There were 2134 in 1974. This is a 1975 decrease of 341 or 16%. In 1975 there were 1507 adult males, 105 adult females, 133 males under 18 and 48 females under 18. In 1974 there were 1749 adult males, 97 adult females, 209 males under 18 and 79 females under 18. In 1975 adult male prisoners decreased 242 (13.8%), adult females increased 36 (3.7%), males under 18 decreased 76 (36%) and females under 18 decreased 31 or 39%.

VEHICLES:

In 1975, eight vehicles were driven a total of 215,780 miles. They consumed 25,426.9 gallons of gasoline at a cost of \$12,506.12. 68 quarts of motor oil were purchased by credit card at a cost of \$50.85. Other vehicle
